Neurology Nurses at Parnassus

We as nurses serve as a clinical resource and are involved throughout the entire patient care coordination process to bridge the gap between the administrative and clinical needs of the patient.

Examples include:

- Triage all patients by a nurse to ensure that the patient is directed to appropriate attention and treatment in a timely and efficient manner, using experience, knowledge and compassion.
- Complex administrative duties requiring clinical expertise between MD and RN
- Collaborate with other nurses within department subspecialty to ensure continuity and smooth transitional care.
- Provide continuous education, reinforcement and encouragement to all our patients.
- Additional roles and responsibilities vary from assisting with physicians in clinic, rounding in the inpatient wards, to
 working at offsite outreach centers throughout the bay area.

The Process

The traditional structure of the ambulatory clinic is actively being redesigned to incorporate quantitative nursing methodologies into the ambulatory setting. Daily huddles, patient satisfaction, and through-put from the perspective of patient experience rather than just referral to appointment are examples of nursing culture and influence.
